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# PROPOSED PROGRAM AND BUDGET OF THE PAN AMERICAN SANITARY ORGANIZATION FOR 1958

#### BUDGET MODIFICATIONS

## Introduction

Pursuant to Resolution II of the 16th Meeting of the Executive Committee, the Director presented in Official Document Nº 17 a provisional draft of the Proposed Program and Budget of the Pan American Sanitary Organization for 1958, for the information of the IX Meeting of the Directing Council. This preliminary draft, together with such comments or modifications as might be appropriate, was to be subsequently presented for consideration to the 31st Meeting of the Executive Committee, which has the constitutional function of preparing, with the cooperation of the Director, the proposed 1958 budget for review and approval by the X Meeting of the Directing Council. The Director herewith presents, for consideration by the Executive Committee, his suggestions for modifications in the preliminary draft submitted in Official Document Nº 17.

As was to be expected, during the year since Official Document Nº 17 was prepared there have been many changes in the health needs of the Member Countries, necessitating a corresponding adjustment of the Bureau's program. Of even greater financial significance is the fact that a series of factors have resulted in sharply increased operating costs for the Bureau. When the Director submitted the draft program for 1958 in Official Document 17, it was possible to propose a balanced program within a budget level of \$3,000,000. It must now be pointed out that, in order to carry out a program for 1958 on the order of that presented at the IX Directing Council, it is necessary to consider a budget ceiling of \$3,191,520 to accommodate the increased operating costs.

The added operating costs for 1958 result from the following:

Needed Budgetary Provision

# A. Increased Operating Costs

1. Effective 1 January 1957, extensive revisions of the Staff Rules were put into effect, subject to the concurrence of the Executive Committee (see Document CE31/5).

#### Needed Budgetary Provision

- 2. A marked increase in common services costs has resulted from the general price rise in rent, utilities, communications, travel, office supplies, and equipment; increased costs of publication and distribution of the Bureau's printed material; and higher cost of reimbursement of federal and local income taxes.

- 3. The continuing rise in cost of living and in wages throughout the Americas has forced increases in local wage scales; the lack of budgetary surplus in 1956, a lack which is anticipated also in 1957 and 1958, has necessitated specific budgetary provision for temporary personnel, and increased salary rates for temporary conference staff are factors which require small increases in operating costs and which must be provided in the budget if the program is not to be contracted.

# B. Increased Staff and Field Requirements

There are, in addition, certain increases in the program and starf of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau which the Director deems essential in order to enable the Bureau to carry out its responsibilities properly:

- 1. Rapid expansion of the peaceful uses of atomic energy makes it necessary to include a specific new budgetary item to finance provision of technical assistance to Member Governments in connection with health programs in this field. It is proposed to add initially one post in the Office of the Director for this purpose.

- 2. It has been necessary to add one professional and four clerical posts to strengthen the staff of the Field Office for the Caribbean and the Zone II Office. These are needed to meet added responsibilities in connection with expanded activities.

### Needed Budgetary Provision

3. A WL.5 post is added in the Documentation and Regulations Unit of the Office of Personnel. This post originally was proposed from Technical Assistance funds for the year 1958 but could not be obtained because of a general ruling that no new posts for operating purposes will be financed from TA funds. This post is necessary to assist in the preparation of personnel documentation.

No. 17, there have also been a number of changes in the requirements for field programs. In a large number of projects increases have resulted from recosting. In other instances projects have been extended and expanded to complete original program objectives as governments' interests and possibilities have changed. The largest component of this group has to do with smallpox eradication, where the groundwork laid by expenditure of the special fund allocated to smallpox by the VI Directing Council has stimulated continuing activities beyond those anticipated a year ago.

The Director recommends that the budget level for 1958 be established at \$3,191,520 in order to maintain the program substantially at the same level as presented for study by the IX Meeting of the Directing Council.

There has been prepared, however, a schedule of program proposals (Annex I) which might be deleted from the budget in the event the Executive Committee feels that the increased operating costs should be apportioned within a \$3,000,000 limitation. It must be pointed out that such a reduction will inevitably disturb what the budget working party described in its report to the IX Directing Council as "a program properly balanced among the various activities" (Document CD9/49).

The Committee is requested to note that, in addition to the projects which have been included in the proposed program, there are additional proposals for implementation in 1958 totalling \$204,700, shown in Annex II. These represent projects developed as the result of discussions with governments by Zone Representatives in early 1957.

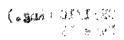
