PAHO AWARD FOR ADMINISTRATION, 1979

In accordance with the amendments approved by the Governing Bodies of the Pan American Health Organization, the PAHO Award for Administration, 1979, should be made to a candidate or candidates either for outstanding work in the field of administration or for a written work on administrative topics applicable to the health sector.

Paragraph 8 of the Criteria for the Award states that "The Director of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau shall forward copies of the documentation submitted to the members of the Award Committee 45 days before the date of the opening of the first annual meeting of the Executive Committee, so that they can meet and decide on the Award during the sessions of the Executive Committee, and report their decision to the Committee in order that it may be duly transmitted to the Directing Council or the Pan American Sanitary Conference."

The Director will send the documentation presented by the countries to each of the members of the Award Committee, designated by the Executive Committee, who will meet during the course of the Executive Committee sessions to make a decision on the Award.

Report of the Award Committee

The Award Committee for the PAHO Award for Administration, made up of Dr. Lelio Bringel Calheiros, of Brasil, Colonel Raul Ampuero Rios, of Peru, and Mr. Hubert Blackett, of Trinidad and Tobago, elected Col. Raul Ampuero Rios as its Chairman. Mr. Miguel A.. Segovia (PASB) served as Secretary.

The Award Committee met in the morning of Tuesday, 26 June, to consider the nominations entered by the Member Countries, for which purpose they also received detailed information on the work done by the Secretariat in accordance with the procedures laid down during the 80th Meeting of the Executive Committee.

During their first session they examined closely the criteria governing the Award and the single nomination put forward by the Government of Panama, the candidate for Costa Rica having been withdrawn, to be nominated again next year.

Upon deliberation, the Committee agreed to meet again in the afternoon of Thursday, 28 June. In that meeting the Committee came to the following decision:

Bearing in mind point 11 of the Procedures and Criteria Governing the PAHO Award for Administration, which authorizes the Committee, when only one nomination is received, to defer it for consideration with others received in the ensuing year, and Recognizing that the work done by Mr. Sucre constitutes and unquestionably valuable contribution to the improvement of health services in Panama,

RECOMMENDS:

That the nomination of Mr. Antonio J. Sucre, presented by the Government of Panama in recognition of his participation in a "rural water supply program in Panama, with full community participation," be deferred for consideration in conjunction with such others as are received in 1980.
