SELECTION OF ONE MEMBER GOVERNMENT ENTITLED TO DESIGNATE A REPRESENTATIVE TO THE INTERNATIONAL COORDINATION COUNCIL OF THE PAN AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR FOOD PROTECTION AND ZOOSES (INPPAZ)

Articles 5 and 6 of the Agreement signed between the Government of the Republic of Argentina and PAHO establishing the Pan American Institute for Food Protection and Zoonoses (INPPAZ) create the International Coordination Council. Its functions are to keep the Director of PAHO informed on the orientation of priorities and strategies for the Institute's work, periodically evaluate its activities, and monitor compliance with the Agreement.

The Council is made up of two (2) representatives of the Government of Argentina, two (2) members designated by the Director of PAHO, three (3) members representing other governments, designated by the Directing Council of PAHO according to a rotational system analogous to that used by the Executive Committee of PAHO, and one (1) representative of each of the participating organizations, as specified in Article 3, section 2.2, of the Agreement.

The Directing Council, at its XXXVI Meeting (1992), selected the Government of Brazil for three (3) years, the Government of the United States of America for two (2) years, and the Government of Uruguay for one (1) year.

The purpose of this agenda item is to request the Directing Council at its XXXVII Meeting to select a Member Government to replace the Government of Uruguay, bearing in mind that this selection will be for a period of three (3) years and the government selected will be entitled to designate a representative to the International Coordination Council of INPPAZ.
