**PAHO BUILDING FUND AND MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR  
OF PAHO-OWNED BUILDINGS**

Resolution CD31.R12 of the XXXI Meeting of the Directing Council (1985) provided for the capitalization of the PAHO Building Fund on a permanent basis to meet the costs of major maintenance and repairs of PAHO-owned buildings.

This document reports on the four current projects in Peru, Venezuela, Brazil, and Argentina. No new projects are proposed.

**1. Electrical System in the Peru Building**

This project, totaling US\$ 42,000, was approved by Resolution CE113.R12 of the 113th Meeting of the Executive Committee (1994). The work involved the complete update of the electrical system in the Peru office. The project was completed within the approved budget in June 1995.

**2. Electrical System in the Venezuela Building**

This project, totaling US\$ 40,000, was approved by Resolution CE116.R5 of the 116th Meeting of the Executive Committee (1995). The work calls for the modernization and balancing of the electrical system of this office purchased by the Organization in 1969. As of this writing the work is in progress.

**3. Maintenance and Repairs of the Brazil Building**

This project, totaling US\$ 204,000, was approved by Resolution CE116.R5 of the 116th Meeting of the Executive Committee. The project includes the provision of fire protection and lightening protection for the building, roof repairs and window caulking, and the installation of an independent power network for the computers. Funds for this project were allocated recently.

**4. Refurbishing the Interior Spaces of the Argentina Office**

This project, totaling US\$ 109,500, was also approved by Resolution CE116.R5. It involves the renovation of the office spaces in the building, including the modernization of the electrical systems. Funds for this project were allocated recently.
