PROPOSED PROGRAM AND BUDGET OF THE PAN AMERICAN SANITARY ORGANIZATION FOR 1959

Introduction

A provisional draft of the proposed program and budget of the Pan American Sanitary Organization for the year 1959 was presented in Official Document Nºº 21, for the information of the X Meeting of the Directing Council. After detailed examination by a working party, the Council took note of the provisional draft program and budget for 1959, commenting that it was subject to further consultation with the health authorities of Member Governments.

Late in 1957 and early in 1958 consultations were carried out with the health authorities concerned to determine, in the light of their current programs, the nature and volume of collaboration desired from PASB/WHO. These consultations indicated an interest in expansion of collaborative activities to a total far exceeding potential funds.

In addition, the Inter-American Committee of Presidential Representatives had recommended that cooperative health activities in the Americas should be expanded through the regular budgetary machinery of the PASO.

In light of these facts the Director presented in Document CE3 $\mu/9$ his suggestions to the Executive Committee for modifying the provisional draft program and budget (Official Document Nº 21). Document CE3 $\mu/9$ included the explanations of the changes from Official Document Nº 21 in the size and character of individual projects.

The Executive Committee decided not to accept the budget as suggested in Document CE34/9 and instructed the Director to prepare a new draft at a level of \$3,300,000. This was presented to the Executive Committee in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1, indicating the postponements and deletions which were found necessary to come within the \$3,300,000 figure.

The Executive Committee adopted Resolution XVI, which reads as follows:

"The Executive Committee,

Having studied the provisional draft of the proposed program and budget for 1959 contained in Official Document N^2 21 and Document CE34/9, prepared by the Director;

Having examined in detail the modifications to the preliminary draft of the proposed program and budget included in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1, prepared by the Director in compliance with the instructions of the Executive Committee; and

Considering the provisions of Article 12-C of the Constitution,

RESOLVES:

- 1. To recommend to the Director that he submit to the XV Pan American Sanitary Conference the Proposed Program and Budget of the Pan American Sanitary Organization for 1959 (Document CE34/9, Rev. 1), in the amount of \$3,300,000 as prepared by the Executive Committee in collaboration with the Director.
- 2. To recommend that the Conference study the possibility of increasing the budget in a proportion that will compensate for the decrease in the purchasing power of money.
- 3. To present Official Document Nº 21 to the Conference for information purpose. $^{\rm H}$

In fulfillment of paragraph 1 of Resolution XVI, Document CE34/9, Rev. 1, is presented as Part A of this document. In order to assist the Conference in relation to paragraph 2 of Resolution XVI, Part B is presented for consideration. The Executive Committee, in recommending that the Conference consider increasing the budget to compensate for currency depreciation, did not establish definite criteria, although increases of 8 and 10 per cent were mentioned in the discussion. After studying the problem, the Director is presenting, in conformity with this recommendation, additional projects in the amount of \$300,000, or approximately 9 per cent increase over the amount in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1. The projects contained in Parts A and B should also be studied in the light of the original presentation in Official Document Nº 21, which is presented to the Conference in conformity with paragraph 3 of Resolution XVI.

The Director believes that the suggested addition of \$300,000 is highly desirable, particularly as the reduction in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1, necessitated the elimination of nearly all fellowships in order to accommodate continuing activities. With the expansion of health services by the Member Governments, the need for trained personnel becomes increasingly acute. This \$300,000 addition would not only restore many of the fellowships and meet a few of the most urgent program requirements, but also seek to achieve the balance of the program which could not be maintained in making the reduction to the amount shown in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1.

In order to show the financial implications for Member Governments, there is presented on page 5 the Scale of Assessments based upon the level of \$3,300,000 (gross budget) presented in Document CE34/9, Rev. 1. There are also shown the additions to these assessments which would be required if the projects shown in Part B in the sum of \$300,000 are approved.


- 2. Amounts not exceeding the appropriations noted under Paragraph 1 shall be available for the payment of obligations in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Bureau incurred during the period 1 January to 31 December 1959, inclusive.
- 3. The appropriations as noted above shall be financed by contributions from Member Governments according to Article IX of the Pan American Sanitary Code; from contributions of France, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom according to Resolutions XV and XL of the V Meeting of the Directing Council, and miscellaneous income accruing to the Pan American Sanitary Bureau.
- 4. The Director is authorized to transfer credits between parts of the budget, provided that such transfers of credits between parts as are made do not exceed 10% of the part from which the credit is transferred. Transfers of credits between parts of the budget in excess of 10% may be made with the concurrence of the Executive Committee. All transfers of budget credits shall be reported to the Directing Council.

Topic 4: Proposed Program and Budget of the Pan American Sanitary
Organization for 1959

BUDGET MODIFICATIONS

Introduction

After presentation of the proposed program and budget for 1959 at the second session of the 34th Meeting of the Executive Committee, and before examination of the program projects or other activities, the Committee voted to return the proposal to the Director with instructions to reduce the ceiling to \$3.300,000.

Pursuant to these instructions, the Director presents herewith revised estimates for consideration by the Executive Committee. As stated in Document CE34/9, the international health program in the Americas is planned as a balanced whole, regardless of sources of funds, and, therefore, activities to be financed under WHO Regular and WHO/TA funds have also been taken into account in preparing the revised PASO regular program and budget. Funds earmarked for specific activities such as malaria eradication are not available for other uses and therefore have not been taken into consideration.

As a first step the Director has reviewed carefully the increases originally proposed in Parts I and II of the budget. By rigid reduction to minimum requirements the totals in these parts have been reduced to figures even below the 1958 level. As a result there is available for Part III, Field and Other programs, the entire increment allowed by the Executive Committee.

In preparing a revised field program the Director has included those projects of a continuining nature and certain country and intercountry projects which he has selected carefully as of highest priority for any new activity to be started in 1959. The continuing projects constitute the great bulk of the revised program, being 50 in number, while the other group includes 11 projects.

On preliminary discussion of the Director's proposed revisions for 1959, the Executive Committee indicated that fellowships have a high priority in the work of the Organization and that every consideration should be given to retain as much money for fellowships in the revised program and budget for 1959 as possible. This has been done in the revised estimates attached hereto. It will be seen that a good many fellowships have been deleted in order to cut the budget presented in Document CE34/9 by \$700,000, but the Director believes that the sum still in the budget for fellowships is in proper proportion to the reduced amounts for other program activities.

There is attached also a table showing the assessments based upon a budget level of \$3,300,000.
