Exhibits I and II reflect the Organization's activities for the year, and Exhibit III shows the financial position of the Organization as of 31 December 1961. Exhibit IV is a consolidated statement of income and expenditure according to fund.

Exhibits V through IX present statements of a similar nature covering funds administered for INCAP and OAS/TCP.

In addition to the Financial Report, there is presented, as an informational annex, a summary and distribution of expenditure. This summary comprises three tables, one showing the activities under all sources of funds by object of expenditure, a second showing PAHO Regular Funds by budget part and object of expenditure, and a third table giving expenditure for all sources of funds by budget part and by individual project.

### Financial Activities in 1961

The following table presents a summary of the combined expenditures relating to activities of the Pan American Health Organization and the, World Health Organization in the year 1961. This table relates only to activities in the Americas and does not reflect disbursement of funds on behalf of other offices principally WHO Headquarters and other Regional Offices, for whom an amount of over \$1,000,000 was disbursed, principally in connection with payments for WHO fellows and for procurement of supplies and equipment.

### Budget Income

Exhibit II shows an amount of \$4,807,545 received from quota contributions, \$3,971,013 of which related to assessed contributions for 1961, and \$836,532 for prior years. The percentage collection of 84.49 per cent of current year contributions reached the highest point since 1957. This represented a sharp increase from 1960 when the figure was 76.32 per cent. This improvement indicates that governments are employing more effective budgetary and fiscal procedures and Ministries of Health are more active in expediting payment.

A total amount of \$148,074 was realized from all other sources of income. Contributions from France, Kingdom of the Netherlands and the United Kingdom was \$46,846 as compared to \$44,097 in 1960. Other Income was \$80,115 as compared to \$111,301, the reduction being due chiefly to lower interest yield and smaller volume of funds available for investment. Excess of Reserve for Unliquidated Obligations refers to funds set aside to meet 1960 budgetary obligations payable in 1961. Due primarily to fellowship awards not being utilized an amount of \$21,113 was not needed to meet obligations and, accordingly, represents income in 1961.

### Budgetary Expenditure

It will be noted in Exhibit I that total obligations for 1961 were \$4,691,745 which is \$108,255 below the authorized budget. This represents a higher level of expenditure than in the previous three years when program activities had to be delayed to avoid depletion of the Working Capital Fund. Nevertheless, every effort was made to economize in the operation of the Organization without impairing service to Member Governments. Expansion of activities in Research, Water Supply, Radiation Protection, and Planning involved increased expenditure in the Washington Office for personnel, office space, office equipment and services. These requirements necessitated transfers to Part II from Parts I and III, within limits authorized to the Director by the Appropriation Resolution.

### Financial Situation and the Working Capital Fund

In the period 1958-1961 growth in programs financed from all sources reflects the expanding contribution of the Organization to health activities and the social and economic development of countries of the Americas. During this time, however, the Pan American Health Organization encountered serious financial difficulties due to an inadequate Working Capital Fund and delayed receipt of quotas.

Two major steps were taken to avoid deficits and to build up the Working Capital Fund. First, the Director adopted a policy of prudent management to keep the average of budgetary expenditures within the income level. Due to the cyclical nature of quota payments this policy was applied over two-year periods. At the same time Member Governments have progressively improved their administrative processes to provide more timely and adequate budget appropriations for quota payments. The second major step was the policy decision of the Directing Council, taking into account a suggestion of the External Auditor, to provide a long-term solution for the Working Capital Fund by instructing the Director to include in the 1961 and future PAHO Regular budgets an amount for gradually increasing and maintaining the Fund at its authorized level of 60 per cent of the budget. Thus a policy of prudent fiscal management and the creation of a dependable source of funds for the Working Capital Fund has established the basis for a strong and stable financial structure.

Tables A and B below reflect the comparative experience of annual income and expenditure, with the effect on the Working Capital Fund. It will be noted in Table A that over the four-year period there is a net surplus of \$181,918. Table B also demonstrates the benefit of budgeting an amount for the Working Capital Fund.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE (Exhibit II)

Sale of Equipment

The total of \$ 8,155 includes sale of obsolete equipment, furniture and automobiles.

### Sale of Publications

Sale of publications in the amount of \$ 1,837, represents sale of PASB Bulletin and various scientific pamphlets published by the Pan American Health Organization. This is a reduction in comparison with sales of \$ 5,217 in 1960.

### Capital Assets

The amount of \$ 538,045 represents the recorded book value of land and buildings of the Headquarters of the Pan American Health Organization in Washington D.C. and Zone Office in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

### Unliquidated Obligations

Unliquidated obligations amounting to \$ 766,463 represent the estimated amount required to liquidate outstanding liabilities pertaining to 1961 Budget and Special Funds. Included in this amount is \$ 311,351, the outstanding balance of 1961 fellowship awards. The other principal items are travel and supplies and equipment.

Fellowship balances of \$ 878 brought forward into 1962 relate to 1960 fellowship awards not fulfilled by 31 December 1961.

### Accrued Repatriation Entitlements

Under the Staff Rules staff members serving at official stations outside their home countries accumulate repatriation benefits payable on termination. A reserve has been established for this contingent liability. A transfer amounting to \$ 24,154 was made in 1961 to raise the fund to the estimated amount of the contingent liability.

### Accrued Service Benefits

Under the Staff Rules, effective 1 January 1958, staff members employed under certain conditions are entitled to a service benefit payable on termination. A reserve has been established for this contingent liability.

### Insurance Equalization Account

This account has been established in order to distribute evenly the expenses for various types of insurance over a period of years. An amount of \$ 4,200 was charged to the 1961 budget of the Organization and credited to this account.

### Building Fund

During 1961 this fund was increased by \$ 30,318, including interest on investments amounting to \$ 6,794. The remaining portion of \$ 23,524 represents an amount transferred to the Building Fund from a special appropriation authorized in 1956 for architectural expenses. This transfer was made to concentrate in one account all available funds and expenditures for the building. Expenditures for initial architectural fees, etc. of \$ 28,488 were effected leaving a balance of \$ 272,068 as at year end.

### Trust Funds

Grants represent funds made available by grantors for programs as shown in schedule 7.

Contributions - The Government of Argentina, under the host country agreement provides a contribution toward the maintenance and operation of the Pan American Zoonoses Center. The Government of Venezuela in accordance with an agreement with the Organization makes a contribution toward the operation of the Zone Office in Caracas. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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REPORT OF THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR
ON THE AUDIT OF THE ACCOUNTS OF THE
PAN AMERICAN HEALTH ORGANIZATION
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1961

### Introduction

1. The audit of the accounts of the Pan American Health Organization for the financial year 1961 has been carried out in accordance with the terms of my appointment as the External Auditor and Article XII of the Financial Regulations of the Organization.

There has been no material change in either the scope or the character of the audit compared with those of earlier years. Transactions, accounts and inventories were examined to the extent necessary to satisfy myself as to the correctness of the accounts. I have also examined the reports of the internal auditors and have been able to review their work which has given me complete satisfaction.

- 2. In 1961 I visited the Zone Offices situated in Mexico, Guatemala, Venezuela and Brazil, as well as the Institute of Nutrition of Central America and Panama (INCAP) and the Aftosa Center. I reviewed the financial and administrative aspects of the work in the offices visited and formed the opinion that it is being performed satisfactorily. I was pleased to observe that the administration of both INCAP and the Aftosa Center showed great improvement over the conditions prevailing at the time of my last visit four years ago.
- 3. With regard to the audit of the 1961 accounts and its result, I wish to state specifically that to my knowledge there have been no cases of fraud or presumptive fraud. The financial transactions have been carried out in conformity with the rules, regulations and policies of the Organization. I consider that the management of the different funds of the Organization has been good and that the financial situation shows an improvement.
- 4. I have certified the correctness of the following financial statements relating to the Pan American Health Organization which have been transmitted to me by the Director:

Statement of Appropriations, Obligations and Balances for the year 1961 (Exhibit I); Statement of Income and Expenditure for the 1961 Budget (Exhibit II);

and the following statements concerning the Organization of American States Program of Technical Cooperation which is administered by the Pan American Health Organization:

### Budgetary Expenditure

5. An amount of \$4,691,745 has been expended against the total appropriated budget of \$4,800,000, leaving an unobligated balance of \$108,255. In the year 1960, the corresponding unobligated figure was \$420,605.

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6. The budgetary expenditure for 1961 compared with those of the two preceding years was as follows:

As can be seen from the table above the total realization of the budget in 1961 has been very good as compared with the two preceding years. The trend of diminishing expenditure percentagewise for Headquarters, to which I have drawn attention in previous years, has continued.

### Budgetary Income

7. Revenues during 1961 compared with those of 1960 and 1959, were as follows:

The total budgetary income for 1961 is \$155,619 higher than the authorized budget. This amount is made up of the collection of arrears of quotas amounting to \$836,532 plus a surplus over budgeted miscellaneous income of \$48,074 less a deficiency in collection of the 1961 quota contributions of \$728,987.

2 C Although the collection of contributions in 1961 shows an increase of 8.17 per cent, in comparison with the collections in 1960, it is my opinion that the collections of current contributions are still too low for any international organization.

9. Notwithstanding the increased collections of arrears during 1961 the balance of uncollected contributions carried forward to 1962 has only decreased by some \$100,000, as can be seen from the following table:

10. Of the outstanding contributions, the following Member States are more than two years in arrears, viz:

Bolivia - 11 years: an amount of \$102,244 Paraguay - 4 years: an amount of \$ 42,800

11. As indicated in the following table the purchases on behalf of government administrations and public institutions have decreased considerably during 1961, with a corresponding decrease in the 3% procurement charge income. The income decreased by \$5,894 over the 1960 figure, compared with a decrease in 1960 of \$14,348 over the 1959 figure.

Procurement charges are made only on purchases for government administrations and public institutions and only on the net purchase price, excluding freight, loading, insurance cost, etc. Procurement in connection with the field activities or of the Organization itself, or on behalf of the World Health Organization are not included in the above table.

### Cash Surplus

12. In 1961 there was a cash surplus (i.e. the difference between the budgetary income in cash and the obligations incurred in respect of the financial year 1961) amounting to \$263,874 as can be seen from Exhibit II. This amount has been transferred to the Working Capital Fund. In 1960 there was a cash deficit of \$38,150 which was covered by withdrawal from the Working Capital Fund.

### Working Capital Fund

13. Resolution VII of the XI Meeting of the Directing Council indicated that the Working Capital Fund should gradually increase until the Fund reaches 60 per cent of the budget level and approved a policy of providing in future budgets an amount for the purpose. Article III paragraph 103.4 of the Financial Rules of the Pan American Health Organization reads as follows: "Any surplus of funds arising from an excess of income over obligations shall be transferred to the Working Capital Fund". Thus the surplus mentioned in paragraph 12 has been transferred to the Working Capital Fund, which at the end of 1961 amounted to \$1,707,059.

### Emergency Procurement Revolving Fund

14. The Directing Council created at its III Meeting an Emergency Procurement Fund in the amount of \$50,000 in order to provide immediate relief to Member States in cases of unforeseen emergency health problems.

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In 1961 total procurement was \$28,107 and reimbursement amounted to \$43,876. This leaves a cash balance of \$44,527 as compared to \$2,858 at the end of 1960.

### Building Fund

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15. The balance of the Building Fund as at 1 January 1961 amounted to \$270,238. During 1961 the fund has increased by \$30,318, including \$23,524 by transfer from the Special Appropriation to Building Fund. This transfer was made in order to accumulate expenditure for the new building under one heading.

The expenditure amounting to \$28,488 consists of awards to architects and other initial costs. The balance at the year-end amounted then to \$272,068.

### Special Malaria Fund

- 16. Voluntary contributions to the Special Malaria Fund reached the amount of \$10,509,400, as at 31 December 1961, of which the United States of America paid \$10,000,000.

### Community Water Supply Fund

17. Of the total voluntary contributions to the Community Water Supply Fund, amounting to \$341,418 the United States of America has paid \$325,000. The income, expenditure and status of the fund as from its inception are shown below:

### Losses

18. During 1961 two typewriters were missing and have been presumed stolen; one was eleven years old with a book value of \$157 and one was a new machine costing \$203. It is understood that claims will be made against the insurance company in 1962.

The items which I reported missing in 1960 have been covered by reimbursement from the insurance company.

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- 19. Summarizing my impression from the audit for 1961 I wish to make the following comments:
  - i) The financial position of the Organization is better at the end of 1961 than it was one year ago, but all efforts must be carried out for better collection of quota contributions and arrears in order to secure the proper fulfillment of the Organization's activities and build up the Working Capital Fund;
  - ii) Work dealing with administrative matters is carried out properly; the weakness I found last year in inventory control of equipment at Headquarters has been overcome;
  - iii) Looking back on the last ten years since my first audit for the year 1951 I note a striking development in the size of the program and efficient financial management. In 1951 expenditure for activities under PAHO Regular was \$1,697,262 as compared with \$4,391,745 in 1961. PAHO Other, WHO Regular and WHO/TA expenditures increased

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from \$1,215,780 to \$6,642,948 in the same period. The years between 1951 and 1961 have brought a maturity in administrative methods and a vast improvement in financial records with respect to completeness, accuracy and clarity. It is gratifying to note that studies are being actively pursued to find still more effective management and accounting methods.

20. The audit was facilitated by the officers of the Organization, and I am pleased to state that the necessary help was given me in the most obliging manner, for which I express my appreciation.
