It was decided that the next meeting of the Executive Committee would be held from 25 to 30 June 1989, subject to a change of dates if necessary depending on the decision of the WHO Executive Board concerning the dates of its Governing Bodies.

It was decided that the XXIII Pan American Sanitary Conference would be held from 24 to 29 September 1990, subject to a change of dates if necessary depending on the decision of the WHO Executive Board concerning the dates of its Governing Bodies.

The term of the United States of America on the Executive Committee having expired, the Committee elected Barbados to membership on the Subcommittee on Planning and Programming.

The terms of Saint Lucia and the United States of America on the Executive Committee having expired, the Committee elected Haiti and Brazil to membership on the Subcommittee on Inter-American Nongovernmental Organizations in Official Relations with PAHO.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Chairman of the Executive Committee and the Secretary ex officio, Director of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau, sign this Final Report in the English and Spanish languages, both texts being equally authentic.
