Topic 22. ELECTION OF TWO MEMBER COUNTRIES TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ON TERMINATION OF THE PERIODS OF OFFICE OF GUATEMALA AND PERU

Pursuant to Article 13-A of the Constitution of the Pan American Health Organization, the Executive Committee

"shall be composed of seven Member Governments elected by the Council for overlapping terms of three years ... A Member Government shall not be eligible for reelection to the Executive Committee until one year has elapsed."

The following chart shows the composition of the Executive Committee together with the expiration dates of the terms of the present Members:

Executive	Committee
Country	Term Expires
Brazil	September 1961
Guatemala	September 1959
Honduras	September 1961
Mexico	September 1960
Peru	September 1959
United States	September 1961
Venezuela	September 1960

Since the terms of Guatemala and Peru will expire immediately after the XI Meeting of the Council, two Member Countries are to be elected to member-ship on the Executive Committee under the provisions of the Constitution.
