AMENDMENTS TO THE STAFF RULES OF THE PAN AMERICAN SANITARY BUREAU

In accordance with the provisions of Staff Rule 020, the Director submits to the Executive Committee, as Annex to this document, for confirmation, the amendments to the Staff Rules he has made since the 107th Meeting.

These revisions are in line with those adopted by the Executive Board of the World Health Organization at its Eighty-ninth Session (Resolution EB89.R12) and are in compliance with paragraph 2 of Resolution XIX adopted by the Executive Committee at its 59th Meeting (1968), which requested the Director to continue to introduce changes as he deems necessary to maintain close similarity between the provisions of the Staff Rules of PASB and those of WHO.

The amendments presented in section 1 result from decisions taken by the United Nations General Assembly at its Forty-fifth and Forty-sixth Sessions on the basis of recommendations made by the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC).

The Annex to this document contains the text of the amended Staff Rules, the purpose of which is briefly explained below. The effective dates of these changes are 1 July 1990, 1 January 1992, and 1 March 1992, as appropriate.

- 1. Amendments Considered Necessary in Light of Decisions Taken by the United Nations General Assembly at its Forty-fifth and Forty-sixth Sessions on the Basis of Recommendations of the International Civil Service Commission
- 1.1 Non-locally Recruited General Service Staff

Consequent to a decision taken by the General Assembly at its Forty-fifth Session, the Executive Committee, at its 107th Meeting, amended Rule 1310.5 to introduce the mobility and hardship scheme for non-locally recruited general service staff and abolish, concurrently, other entitlements with effect from 1 July 1990. Rule 1310.6 has now also been amended to delete a reference to the entitlement of financial incentive which no longer exists.

1.2 Schedule of Salaries for the Professional Category and Directors' Posts

The Commission recommended an increase of 8.6% in the current base/floor salary scale through the consolidation of post adjustment classes.

The United Nations General Assembly approved, with effect from 1 March 1992, a revised base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher categories incorporating an increase of 6% through the consolidation of post adjustment classes into net base salary, on the basis of the "no loss-no gain" formula. As a consequence, there will be adjustments in the post adjustment indices and multipliers at all duty stations, effective 1 March 1992. The increase is intended to reduce the gap between the comparator's current net base salary and the present United Nations scale. As a consequence, changes are also required to the schedule of staff assessment rates for professional and higher-graded staff without dependants, effective 1 March 1992.

Staff Rules 330.1.1 and 330.2 have been amended accordingly.

1.3 Salaries of Ungraded Posts

As a consequence of the revision of the base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher categories described in the preceding paragraphs, adjustments to the remunerations of the Assistant Director, the Deputy Director, and the Director should also be considered.

Since 1962 it has been the policy of the Executive Committee to set the salary of the Deputy Director at the level of other WHO Regional Directors and that of the Assistant Director at \$1,000 less.

Considering that PASB Staff Regulation 3.1 states, "the salaries of the Deputy Director and the Assistant Director shall be determined by the Director of the Bureau with the approval of the Executive Committee," this body may wish to follow the same practice and adjust the annual net salary of the Deputy Director to \$74,571 at dependency rate and \$67,436 at single rate; and that of the Assistant Director at \$73,571 at dependency rate and \$66,436 at single rate, effective 1 March 1992.

Since 1969, the practice of the Governing Bodies of PAHO has been to maintain the salary of the Director at the same level as that of the Deputy Director-General of WHO.

The XX Meeting of the Directing Council, in operative paragraph 2 of Resolution XX, requested "the Executive Committee, in case of any future adjustments in respect of professional and ungraded categories of posts, to make recommendation to the Conference or the Directing Council concerning the appropriate level of the salary of the Director."

The Executive Committee, following this guide, may wish to recommend to the XXXVI Meeting of the Directing Council that it adjust the annual net salary of the Director to \$82,297 at dependency rate and \$73,824 at single rate, effective 1 March 1992.

The above changes are also on the basis of the "no loss-no gain" formula.

1.4 Staff Assessment Rates for the General Service Category

Pending completion of the comprehensive review of pensionable remuneration and consequent pensions of the general service and related categories of staff, the General Assembly has approved a revised scale of assessment for this category of staff with effect from 1 January 1992. Rule 330.1.2 has been amended accordingly.

2. Budgetary Implications

The budgetary implications of the above changes in 1992-1993 are additional estimated costs of \$250,000 in funds from all sources. This is due to the impact of the higher-base salary scale on the mobility and hardship scheme and on terminal payments. These additional costs will be met during 1992-1993 from within the allocations established.

3. Draft Resolutions

The Executive Committee is invited to consider two proposed resolutions: the first confirms the amendments reproduced in the Annex to this document; the second concerns the revision of the remuneration levels of staff in the ungraded posts.

THE 109th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE,

Having considered the amendments to the Staff Rules of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau submitted by the Director in the Annex to Document CE109/21;

Recognizing the need for uniformity of conditions of employment of PASB and WHO staff; and

Bearing in mind the provisions of Staff Rule 020,

RESOLVES:

To confirm the amendments to the Staff Rules of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau submitted by the Director in the Annex to Document CE109/21, with effect from 1 July 1990, concerning the elimination of the financial incentive for non-locally recruited general service staff; with effect from 1 January 1992 concerning the staff assessment rates for the general service category; and with effect from 1 March 1992 concerning the salary scale applicable to staff in the professional category and directors' posts and the rates of staff assessment for the professional and higher-graded staff without dependants.

Proposed Resolution

SALARIES FOR UNGRADED POSTS

THE 109th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE,

Considering the revision made to the base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher categories, effective 1 March 1992;

Taking into account the recommendation of the Eighty-ninth Session of the WHO Executive Board to the Forty-fifth World Health Assembly related to the remuneration of the Regional Directors, the Deputy Director-General, and the Director-General; and

Bearing in mind Staff Regulation 3.1 of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau and Resolution XX of the XX Meeting of the Directing Council,

RESOLVES:

- 1. Effective 1 March 1992, to:
 - a) Establish the annual net salary of the Deputy Director at \$74,571 at dependency rate and \$67,436 at single rate;
 - b) Establish the annual net salary of the Assistant Director at \$73,571 at dependency rate and \$66,436 at single rate.
- 2. To recommend to the XXXVI Meeting of the Directing Council that it establish the annual net salary of the Director at \$82,297 at dependency rate and \$73,824 at single rate, effective 1 March 1992.
