Topic 19: ELECTION OF THREE MEMBER COUNTRIES TO FILL THE VACANCIES ON THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CREATED BY THE TERMINATION OF THE PERIODS OF OFFICE OF EL SALVADOR, PERU AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Article 13, paragraph A of the Constitution of the Pan American Sanitary Organization states in part that

"the Executive Committee shall be composed of seven Member Governments elected by the Council for overlapping terms of three years... A Member Government shall not be eligible for reelection to the Executive Committee until one year has elapsed."

The following chart shows the current composition of the Executive Committee together with the expiration dates of the terms of the Members.
