Topic 26: ELECTION OF TWO MEMBER COUNTRIES TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ON TERMINATION OF THE PERIODS OF OFFICE OF MEXICO AND VENEZUELA

Pursuant to Article 13-A of the Constitution of the Pan American Health Organization, the Executive Committee

"shall be composed of seven Member Governments elected by the Council for overlapping terms of three years ... A Member Government shall not be eligible for reelection to the Executive Committee until one year has elapsed."
