COVID-19 - Highlights

The Government of Bolivia is implementing a national oxygen emergency plan to address the demand for oxygen tanks as infections grow in the third wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in Bolivia. In the short term, the plan includes the installation of clinical oxygen plants and mobile hospitals. Bolivia has a range of 3,000 infections per day with 5% of cases requiring intensive care or immediate care beds. The Vice Minister of Health highlighted that this requires 150 new beds a day and the health system cannot withstand this requirement; it is a priority to stop the chain of transmission.

The CDC published a study on the <u>Hospitalization of Adolescents Aged 12–17 Years with Laboratory-Confirmed COVID-19</u>. Using the Coronavirus Disease 2019-Associated Hospitalization Surveillance Network (COVID-NET), the CDC examined the data which confirmed that hospitalization rates were lower in adolescents ages 12-17 compared to those in adults but were higher than children aged 5-11 from March 2020- April 2021. Nearly one-third of hospitalized required ICU admission.

Based on viral genomic sequencing, on 14 December 2020, the authorities of the United Kingdom reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Alpha; on 18 December 2020, the authorities of the Republic of South Africa reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Beta; and, on 13 January 2021, the authorities of Brazil reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Gamma. SARS-CoV-2 variants Alpha, Beta, and Gamma are defined as Variants of Concern (VOC), together with variant Delta, identified in India in October 2020.¹

Starting on 18 December 2020, WHO shared that information with authorities across the globe about SARS-CoV-2 VOC and Variants of Interest (VOI), through dedicated channels established under the International Health Regulations (IHR), as well with the public through the WHO web site.^{2,3,4}

International traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties in the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants

The table below summarizes international traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties to the IHR in the Region of the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants. Measures adopted are consistent with current Temporary Recommendations, issued by the Director-General of WHO in the context of the Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC), determined on 30 January 2020 according to IHR provisions.







Argentina: On 14 March 2021, due to daylight savings time observed in Eastern Standard Time zone, the Argentina data is no longer published by 3:00PM EST same day and is henceforth included in the following day table. Between 22 February and 14 March 2021, the data had corresponded to the same date.

Bahamas: According to the 1 June 2021 Bahamas Ministry of Health (MoH) publication, there are a total of 28 additional deaths under investigation, available at: https://bit.ly/3uqVMnb.

Ecuador: According to a 6 September Ecuador Ministry of Public Health press release, only cases confirmed by RT-PCR will be reported; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 8,956 cases. Available at: https://bit.ly/3h2EWEA.

El Salvador: Cumulative cases and deaths as published by the Government of El Salvador: https://covid19.gob.sv/. The government presents a retroactively adjusted epidemiological curve of daily cases on the same dashboard.
