COVID-19 – Highlights

- Cases are on the rise once more in Saint Kitts and Nevis with 32 cases recorded in the previous 24 hours as of the 12 June reporting. This is almost three times the cases recorded on 9 June when 11 new cases were reported. The most recent data (12 June) indicates 123 active cases on the island and 0 deaths to date. SKNIS gov
- 2. According to a NYTimes database, COVID-19 testing in the United States continues to decline a trend that experts warn could make it difficult to identify outbreak and track the spread of the outbreak. Daily COVID-19 tests peaked during Mid-January in the US when about 1.8 million had been tested. The numbers have since dropped by more than half with an average of 700,000 tests per day being conducted. NYTimes









Argentina: On 14 March 2021, due to daylight savings time observed in Eastern Standard Time zone, the Argentina data is no longer published by 3:00PM EST same day and is henceforth included in the following day table. Ecuador: According to a 6 September Ecuador Ministry of Public Health press release, only cases confirmed by RT-PCR will be reported; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 8,956 cases. Available at: https://bit.ly/3h2EWEA,,,

El Salvador: Cumulative cases and deaths as published by the Government of El Salvador: https://covid19.gob.sv/. The government presents a retroactively adjusted epidemiological curve of daily cases on the same dashboard.

Guadeloupe: Deaths are aggregated for Guadeloupe, Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy in Santé Publique France weekly publications; death counts for Guadeloupe are calculated subtracting deaths in Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy. Available at: https://bit.ly/39UMysd

Peru: Aggregated case total as reported by the Peru MoH; latest disaggregated data available is 594,805 by RT-PCR + 477,780 by antigen tests + 925,471 by other RDTs. Antibody tests, including RDTs based on antibody detection, are not recommended for use by PAHO/WHO in clinical diagnosis. Puerto Rico: Aggregated case total as reported by the Puerto Rico Department of Health (DoH); 122,552 were positive by RT-PCR and 16,812 were positive by antigen tests; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or serological RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 33,965 cases. United States of America: Case and death counts include both confirmed and probable classifications, as published on the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (US CDC) website on 13-June.
