COVID-19 - Highlights

The Parliament of St. Kitts and Nevis has <u>extended the State of Emergency</u> <u>declared on June 15 through December 31, 2021</u>. The extension will help effectively manage the COVID-19 pandemic in the Federation.

The Republic of Panama has continued its vaccination strategy. The Ministry of Health has indicated sufficient doses of the Pfizer and AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccines are available for the populations that want to be vaccinated. The regional health authorities have called on men and women 30 years and older to register and schedule their vaccine appointments. From 9 June through 1 July over 50,000 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine have been administered in the Metropolitan Health Region.

Staring the weekend of 26 June 2021, the PAHO COVID-19 daily situation reports will no longer be published on Saturdays and Sundays. The reports will continue to be published during the workweek – Monday through Friday – at the regularly scheduled time, with the exception of any official holidays observed by PAHO in Washington, DC

Based on viral genomic sequencing, on 14 December 2020, the authorities of the United Kingdom reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Alpha; on 18 December 2020, the authorities of the Republic of South Africa reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Beta; and, on 13 January 2021, the authorities of Brazil reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as Gamma. SARS-CoV-2 variants Alpha, Beta, and Gamma are defined as Variants of Concern (VOC), together with variant Delta, identified in India in October 2020.¹

Starting on 18 December 2020, WHO shared that information with authorities across the globe about SARS-CoV-2 VOC and Variants of Interest (VOI), through dedicated channels established under the International Health Regulations (IHR), as well with the public through the WHO web site.^{2,3,4}

International traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties in the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants

The table below summarizes international traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties to the IHR in the Region of the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants. Measures adopted are consistent with current Temporary Recommendations,⁵ issued by the Director-General of WHO in the context of the Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC), determined on 30 January 2020 according to IHR provisions.







Argentina: On 14 March 2021, due to daylight savings time observed in Eastern Standard Time zone, the Argentina data is no longer published by 3:00PM EST same day and is henceforth included in the following day table. Between 22 February and 14 March 2021, the data had corresponded to the same date.

Bahamas: According to the latest Bahamas Ministry of Health (MoH) publication, there are a total of 29 additional deaths under investigation, available at: https://bit.ly/3wh84Aq.

Ecuador: According to a 6 September Ecuador Ministry of Public Health press release, only cases confirmed by RT-PCR will be reported; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 8,956 cases. Available at: https://bit.ly/3h2EWEA.

El Salvador: Cumulative cases and deaths as published by the Government of El Salvador: https://covid19.gob.sv/. The government presents a retroactively adjusted epidemiological curve of daily cases on the same dashboard.

Guadeloupe: Deaths are aggregated for Guadeloupe, Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy in Santé Publique France weekly publications; death counts for Guadeloupe are calculated subtracting deaths in Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy. Available at: https://bit.ly/39UMysd.

Puerto Rico: Aggregated case total as reported by the Puerto Rico Department of Health (DoH); 123,013 were positive by RT-PCR and 17,093 were positive by antigen tests; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or serological RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 33,965 cases. United States of America: Case and death counts include both confirmed and probable classifications, as published on the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (US CDC) website on 2-July. Excludes American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, Palau, Republic of Marshall Islands and the United States Virgin Islands.
