COVID-19 - Highlights

Today's map is a spotlight on COVID-19 incidence and ICU occupancy in Chile at the sub-national level.

The left layout shows the COVID-19 case incidence per 100,000 population in EW 41-43 and the right one shows percent change in COVID-19 ICU occupancy between EW 41-43, and the ICU occupancy rate per 100,000 population in EW 43 in each of the adm1 territories in Chile. Most territories had no substantial change — only Arica y Parinacota had a decrease in ICU Occupancy. Tarapaca, Araucania, and O'Higgins had at least a >50% increase in ICU occupancy in the last 3 weeks






Spotlight – COVID-19 Situation Update – Haiti Country Office Situation Report. #53

Trends: As of November 4, 2021, Haiti's Ministry of Public Health and Population (MSPP) has reported 24,073 laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the beginning of the pandemic on March 19, 2020. Ouest continues to be the most heavily affected department (15, 793 cases) followed by Centre (1, 344 cases) and Artibonite (1, 313 cases). In week 43 (October 24 to October 30, 2021), 95 confirmed cases were reported in Haiti. The positivity rate (i.e., the share of specimens testing positive for COVID-19) is estimated at


Figure 1. Number of confirmed and suspected COVID-19 cases, positivity rate (%) by epidemiological week



15%.According to MSPP, eleven (11)additional deaths were reported during week 43. To date, deaths have notified among laboratoryconfirmed cases. which corresponds to fatality rate (CFR) of 3%. Up to now, a total of 20, 374 cases have recovered, which accounts for 85% of all confirmed cases.

Laboratory: The labo moto teams have performed 271 tests for COVID-19 during this week, of which 18 were done in the community (home or shelter/camp testing) and the remainder was carried at health facilities.

Severity: As of October 27, the MSPP has reported that 4,353 confirmed cases (18% of the totality) have been hospitalized. During week 43rd, 140 patients were admitted to hospital for COVID-19. The hospital occupancy rate for week 43 is 38%. The occupancy rate at St Luc hospital – which has the highest number of available COVID-19 beds (110) – is 42%. Hospital Sacre Coeur in Milot has indefinitely stopped all its operations due to security concerns. Its COVID-19 patients were transferred to Hopital



Universitaire de Mirebalais and Hopital de la Convention Baptiste d'Haiti. Hopital La Providence des Gonaives has also closed its doors because of the lack of oxygen and medicines to care for COVID-19 patients. The Sud-Est department still does not have a functional facility to care for COVID-19 patients. Employees at the COVID-19 treatment unit of St Antoine Hospital (Jérémie) have not received their salary for the past 4 months and threaten to stop working if the problem is not solved in a prompt manner. Death toll has significantly increased in the past weeks among the hospitalized patients. See figure 3.


Vaccination

As of October 31, 2021, a total of 135, 256 doses of vaccines have been administered in the country and 39, 335 people are fully vaccinated. The number of vaccination sites have increased from 165, located in 71 communes of the 10 geographical departments of the country. Of the total, 37 of these sites are mobile units for vaccination. Primary estimates report that 1.3% of the targeted population has received at least one dose of vaccine and that 0.5% of the same target is fully vaccinated.



Argentina: On 14 March 2021, due to daylight savings time observed in Eastern Standard Time zone, the Argentina data is no longer published by 3:00PM EST same day and is henceforth included in the following day table. Between 22 February and 14 March 2021, the data had corresponded to the same date.

Puerto Rico: Aggregated case total as reported by the Puerto Rico Department of Health (DoH); 152,004 were positive by RT-PCR and 33,151 were positive by antigen tests; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or serological RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 33,965 cases.
